Annual Career Authorization Law

MCL 380.1233b

- state-approved CTE program
- ▶ 6-12 non-CTE industrial technology education program







Annual Career Authorization Requirements

- ► High school diploma or GED
- Confirm certified and endorsed candidate NOT available for the assignment

- Assigned a mentor
- ► Verify work experience <u>CTE</u>:

 <u>Recent and Relevant</u>

 <u>Experience Requirements</u>

 <u>quidance</u>







Annual Career Authorization Requirements – cont.

- ► If required...
 - ► Business or industry license or certification
 - ► Valid vs. expired


- ► Maintain experience



Authorizations No Longer Available

- ▶ Long-Term Substitute Annual Occupational Authorization
- ► Less Than Class Size Annual Occupational Authorization
- ► Adult Education Annual Occupational Authorization







Substitute Career Authorization

- ► Same experience as the ACA
- ▶ No credit requirement
- ▶ Daily or intermittent use
- Validity
 - ► State Aid (90-consecutive calendar days)
 - ► CTE Funding (40-consecutive calendar days)
- ► Non-renewable
