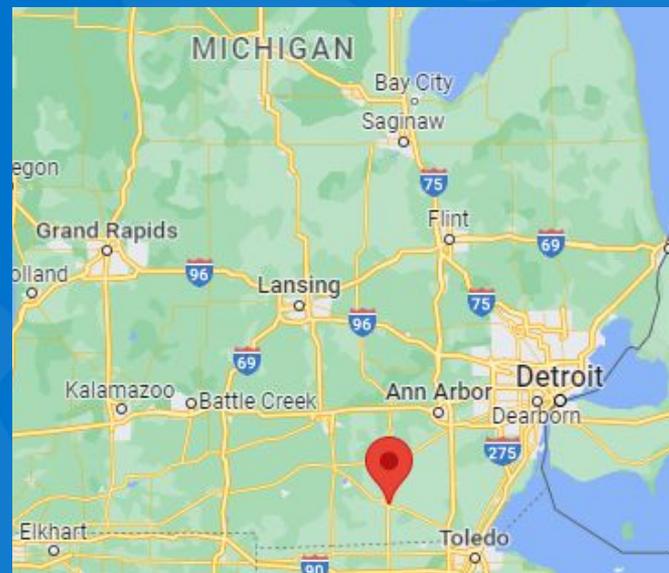

“Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an evidence-based, tiered framework for supporting *students’* behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health.”

Why can't we finish the last sentence as automatically as we do the others?

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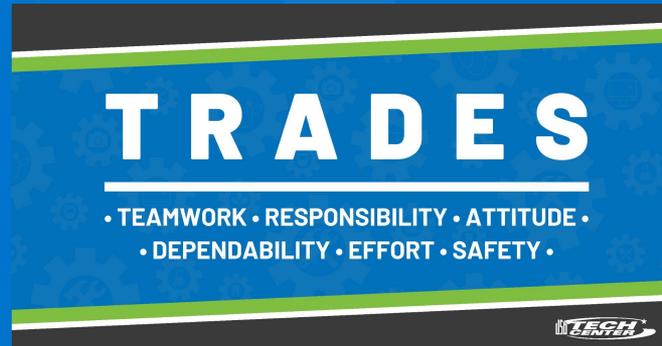

- **Monitors student outcome data in the areas of attendance, failure rates, and behavior**

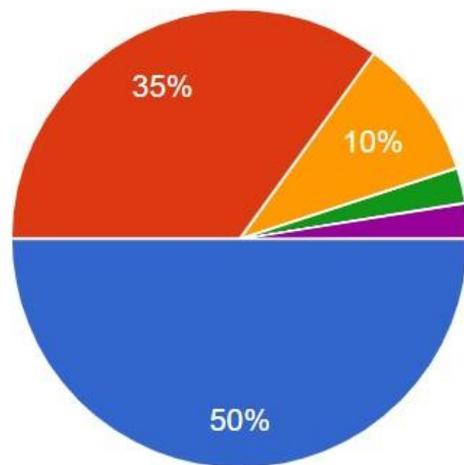
Getting Buy-In

Establishing Our Why

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52% is the average retention rate in employment

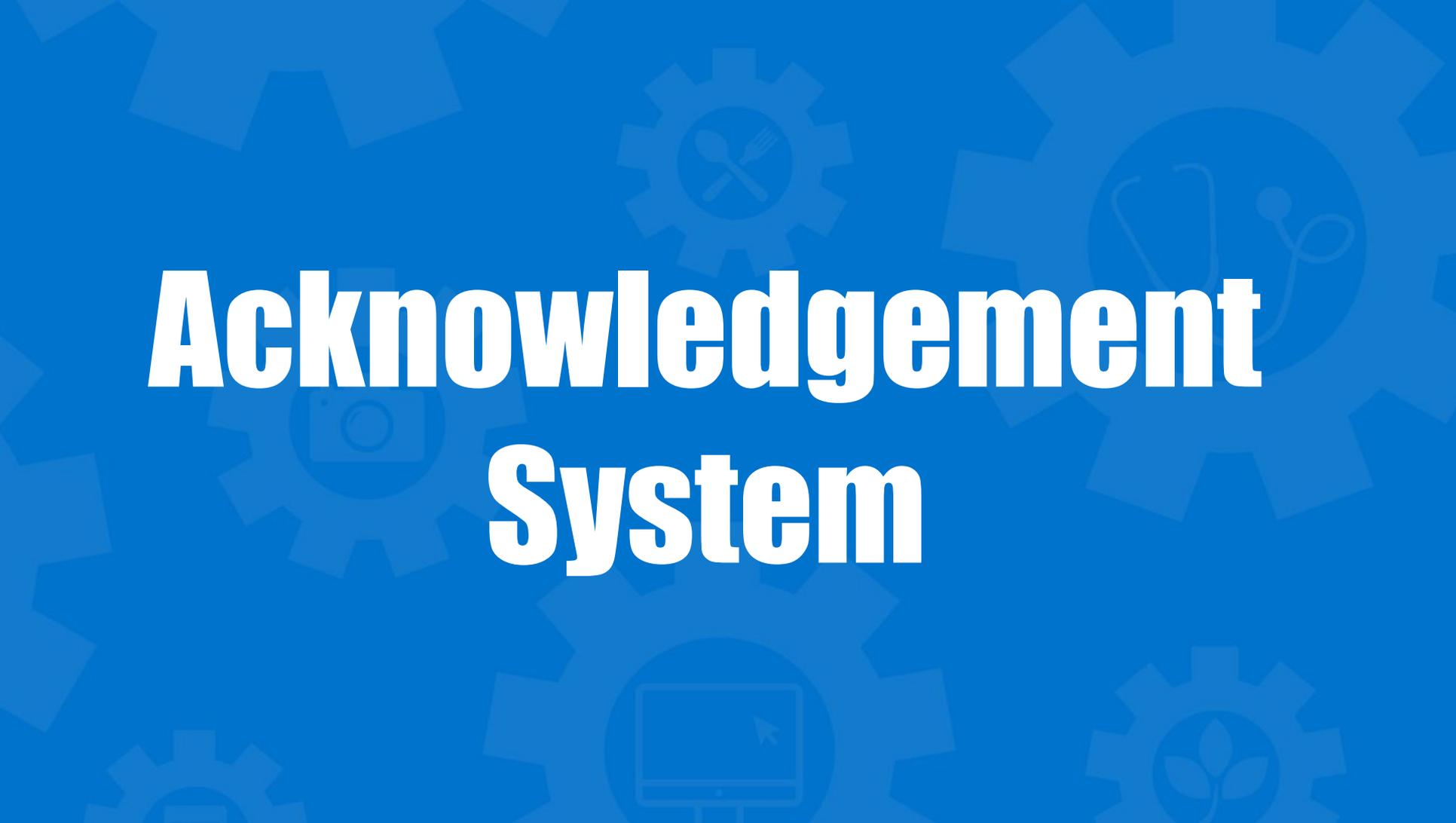

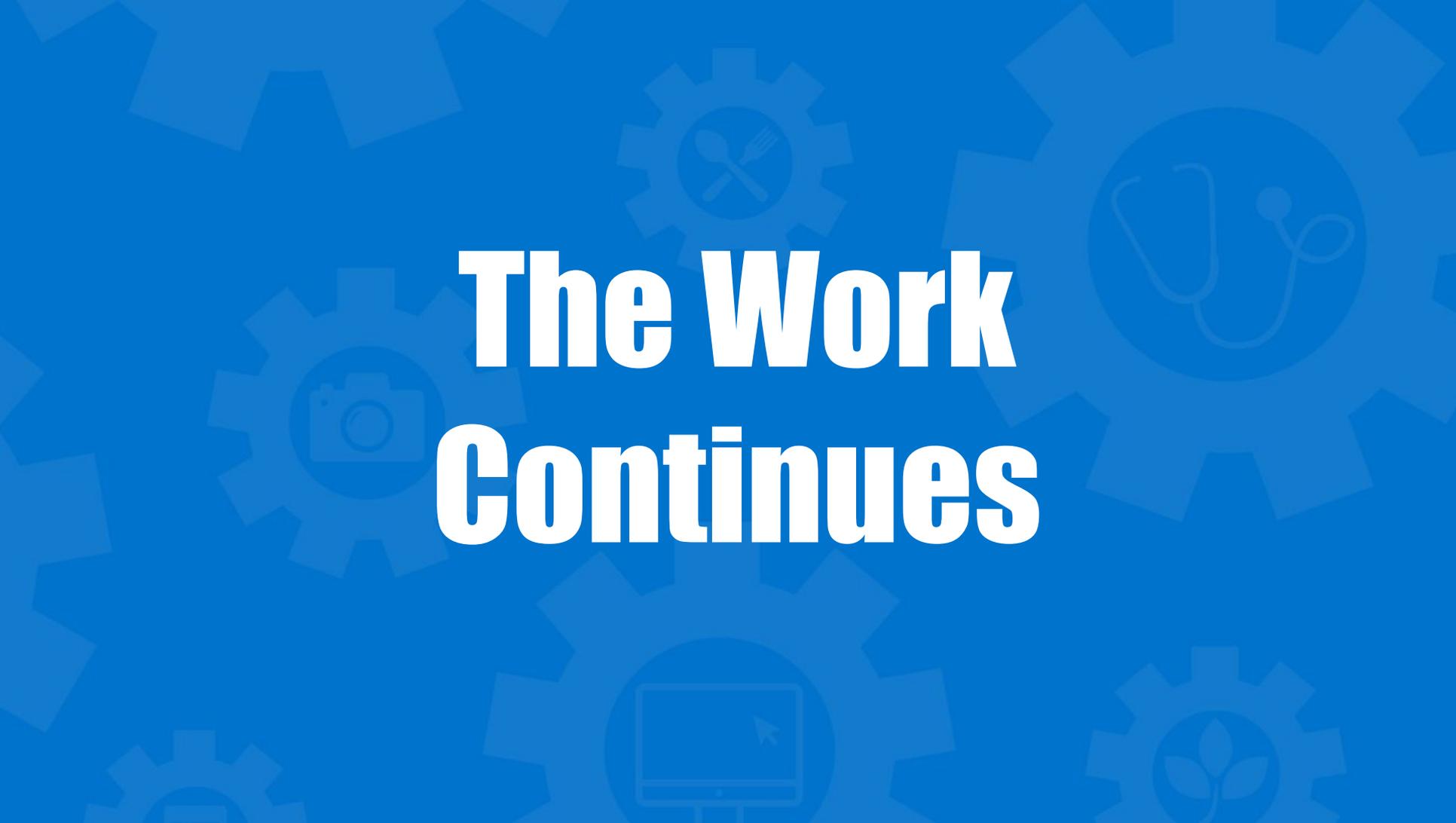
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Student Involvement

The Work Continues

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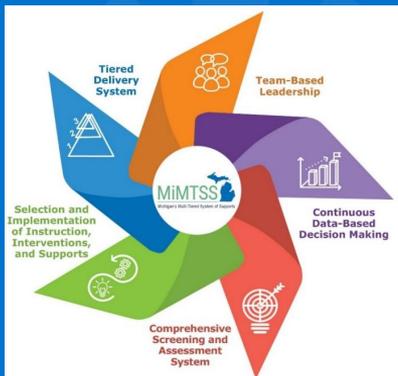
- Tiered Fidelity Inventory
